## Frequently Asked Questions

### What footpaths are closed?

- In Carbis Bay, the section of the South West Coast Path which runs through the Carbis Bay Hotel will be closed with a temporary diversion in place.

### What Identification do I need if I am visiting or staying in St Ives or Carbis Bay?

- You will need to have a photo ID, a booking reference with your name, the address that you are staying and the dates you are staying.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### Do I need Identification to pass a check point if I am walking?

- You do not require identification if you are walking. This is only required if you are travelling in a motor vehicle.

### My family are coming to stay and I live within the check points, can they still come?

- Yes absolutely, although as there will be disruption on the roads, we would encourage you to leave plenty of time to get to your destination. If you are passing through a check point in a car, you will also need a photo ID, and some form of information that ties you to that address.

### Will I still be able to access emergency services throughout the event if I need help?

- Emergency services will still be functioning throughout the summit as normal.

### Is Tesco Stores at Carbis Bay still open?

- Yes it is, although it will only be open to people walking throughout the G7 Summit.

### Can I find information about the G7 Summit in Easy Read and in different languages?

- Yes, information is available on the G7 Website and by clicking on Accessibility you will be able to access documents and information in easy read format and in different languages.

### Are there restrictions in the air during the G7 Summit?

- Yes, there are restrictions in the air between 7 June & 13 June and further information can be found on at [dc.police.uk/g7](https://dc.police.uk/g7)

Please do keep an eye on the G7 website for updates in relation to footpath closures in Falmouth. Information will be released on our website as soon as it is confirmed.

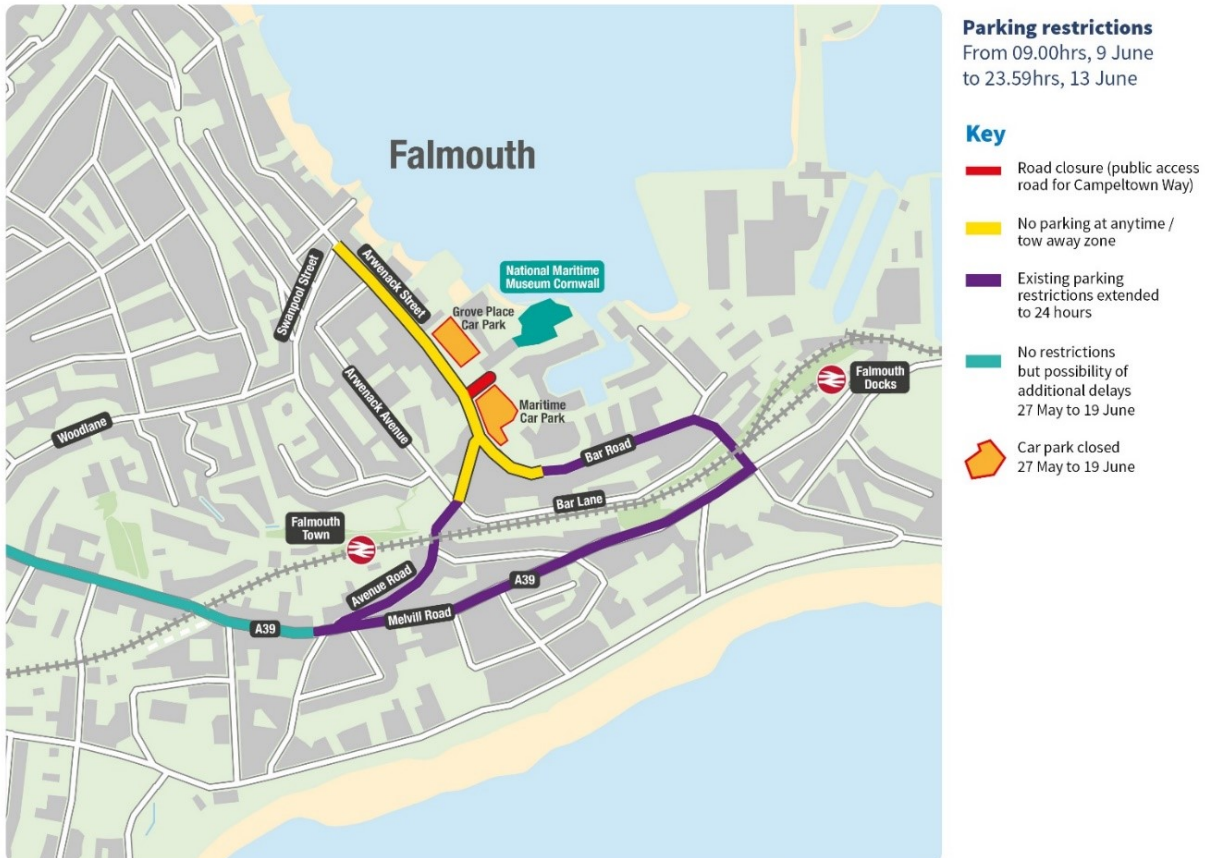
# St Ives & Carbis Bay access map
